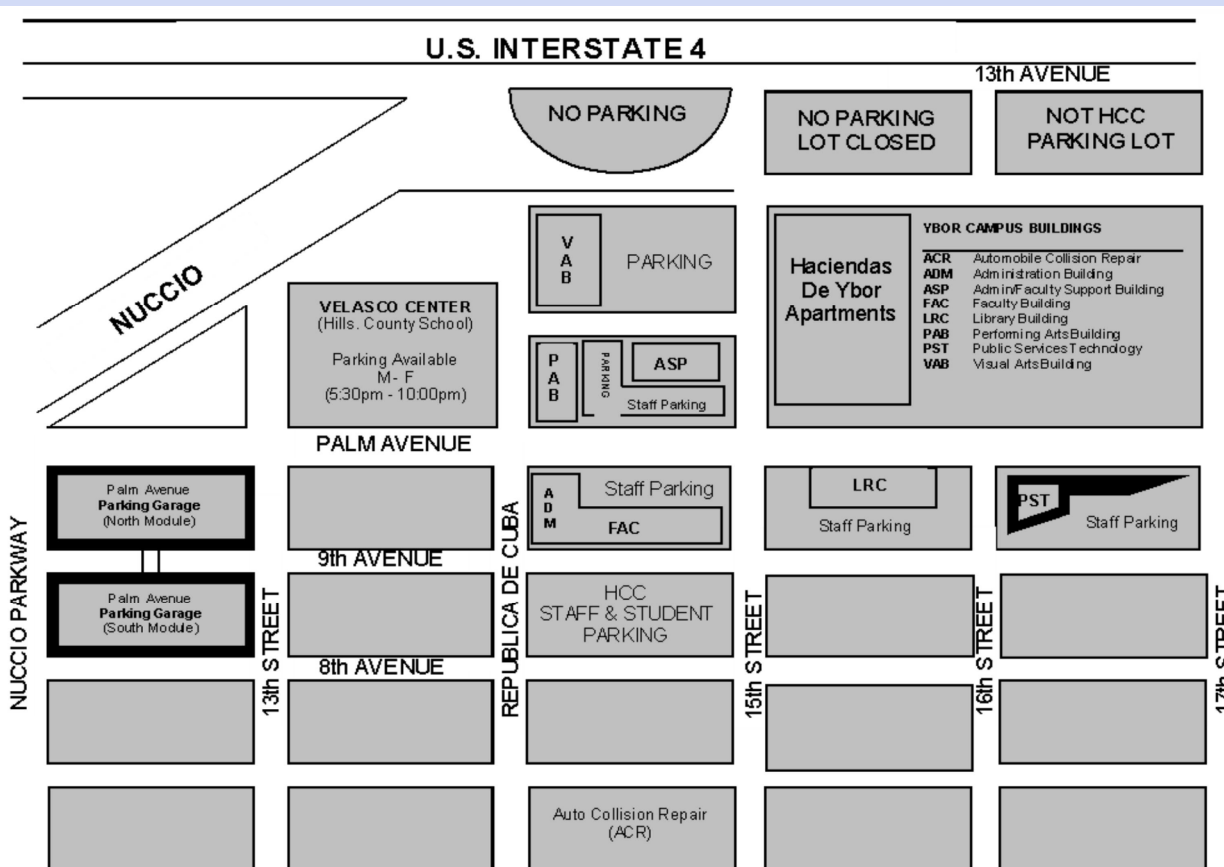

# Power Point for Instructors

***Do you need Continuing Education hours to meet the requirements for your FDLE Instructor recertification?***

***Then this is the course for you!***

**This eight hour course was specifically designed with instructors in mind!**

As part of the Criminal Justice Standards & Training Commission's on-going pursuit of quality educators instructors are now required to have continuing education.

Pursuant to Rule 11B-20.0017 of the Florida Administrative Code instructors must "successfully complete the instructional, proficiency & continuing education requirements every four years" to maintain their instructor certifications.

This course is approved for mandatory retraining only.

This eight-hour specialized course was designed to enhance the law enforcement instructor's ability to present professional training classes. Topics covered during this block of instruction include: slide show construction, graphics, in-show video, animation and sound. Everything you need to present the most up-to-date training presentations!

## **Did you know???**

The expiration of an instructor's certification shall be March 31st of the fourth year following the instructor's initial certification.
